Beautiful drives and walks through the grounds and neighboring country in all directions may be enjoyed by those desiring open air exercise of this kind.






HE Life Saving Station here is as important as any on the lakes. The crew consists of seven men in charge of Captain F. Fountain. Although the station has been established but three years, several lives have already been saved and much daring and bravery shown by the officer and men. Frequent drills during the season, in which the crew go out in the lake in their large lifeboat, which they capsize, right again and climb back in and perform many other difficult and daring acts, are of great interest.

Hay fever sufferers will find instant and permanent relief here. With Round Lake on the north, Pine Lake on the east and Lake Michigan on the west, the dreaded "off-land breeze" is here practically unknown.

HE WATER Supply here is particularly good, and too much cannot be said in its praise. It is drawn from three wells upon the grounds and analysis shows it to be as nearly pure as it is possible for water to be. No fear need be had from a "change of water" here as no harmful effects are felt from its unstinted use by the most delicate.


BELVEDERE STATION


