

HE Life Saving Station here is as important as any on the lakes. The crew consists of seven men in charge of Captain F. Fountain. Although the station has been established but five years, several lives have already been saved and much daring and bravery shown by the officer and men. Frequent drills during the season, in which the crew go out on the lake in their large lifeboat, which they capsize, right again and climb back in, and perform many other difficult and daring acts, are of great interest.



THE BELVEDERE WATER SUPPLY

HE Association has its own independent water plant, consisting of three deep artesian wells, engines and pumps, capable of furnishing two hundred gallons per minute, with which to supply the Belvedere and cottages with pure water. The fine quality of the water is beyond question, as the following analysis made by Francis E. West, M. S., Professor of Chemistry at Alma College, Alma, Michigan, one of the most prominent chemists of the state, will show:




