

rounded by nearly one hundred cottages, all owned by members of the Charlevoix Summer Home Association.
















The attendance at these parties and entertainments is limited to the guests of the Belvedere, the cottagers upon the grounds and invited guests.







The Belvedere Water Supply

The Association has its own independent water plant, consisting of three deep artesian wells, engines and pumps, capable of furnishing two hundred gallons per minute, with which to supply the Belvedere and cottages

with pure water. The fine quality of the water is beyond question, as the following analysis made by Francis E. West, M. S., Professor of Chemistry at Alma College, Alma, Mich., one of the most prominent chemists of the state will show:









Francis E. West, *Professor of Chemistry*. Chemical Laboratory, Alma College, April 26, 1905.

As the Michigan standard of purity allows five hundred parts per million, of solids, this water is very much better than the State Standard, and a purer natural water would be hard to obtain. No fear need be felt from its unstinted use.

Belvedere Station






