
The annual Tournament held in August is open to guests of the Hotel as well as members and guests of the Club, and handsome trophies are presented to the winners.

Boating on Lake Charlevoix with canoe, rowboat, sail boat or motor boat affords many hours of exhilarating pleasure.








THERE are eight fine, clay tennis courts in perfect condition for the free use of guests.
