Architectural Style Prairie

Two-and-a-half story gable front with hipped roof front porch. The main and porch roofs have exposed rafter tails. The first two floors are clad in narrow clapboard siding and the gables are clad in wood shingles. The two types of original windows remain, the double-hung with the patterned muntins in the upper sash, as well as the multi-pane casement windows. The front porch is supported by heavy tapered wood piers with a base are indicative of the Prairie style. The wide front porch and large windows on the front façade take advantage of the lake views.

Significant Features

- Gable front with cross gables toward the rear. The façade is symmetrical and features a full width front porch with a hipped roof supported by wood pillars. The simple wood railing between the pillars appears to be original.
- The narrow profile clapboard siding at the first two floors and shingle siding in the gables.
- The projecting bays, including the supporting brackets and exposed rafter tails.
- The wood windows with the patterned muntins and multiple panes, including the surrounding wood trim.

Condition

The cottage is in good repair with no obvious condition issues. The original cottage appears to retain most of its original materials and features. The shutters are not original.
