Architectural Style Originally Queen Anne, now has Colonial Revival elements

Although the east portion of the footprint of the two-story cottage is similar to the original, the alteration of the front porch and main roofline have eliminated the original Queen Anne detailing. A decorated gable was eliminated from the main roof line. The porch was enlarged and what appears to have been turned posts have been changed to Doric columns. This change probably happened historically as it was a common treatment to Queen Anne houses.

Significant Features

- Clapboard siding.
- Doric porch columns.
- Shape of the roof line near the peak which is original.
- Second floor window openings, the locations appear to be original.

Condition

The cottage is in good repair no issues are apparent.
