Architectural Style Prairie with Queen Anne influences

The shallow hip roof with hip roof dormers and exposed rafter tails along with the rectangular massing of this two-story cottage are indicative of the Prairie style as is the narrow clapboard siding on the first floor and shingle siding on the second floor. The tower at the southeast corner with its fieldstone base, shingle siding and dome roof is a Queen Anne influence. The full width front porch has carved brackets which are also indicative of Queen Anne influences. The windows appear to have originally been one-over-one.

Significant Features

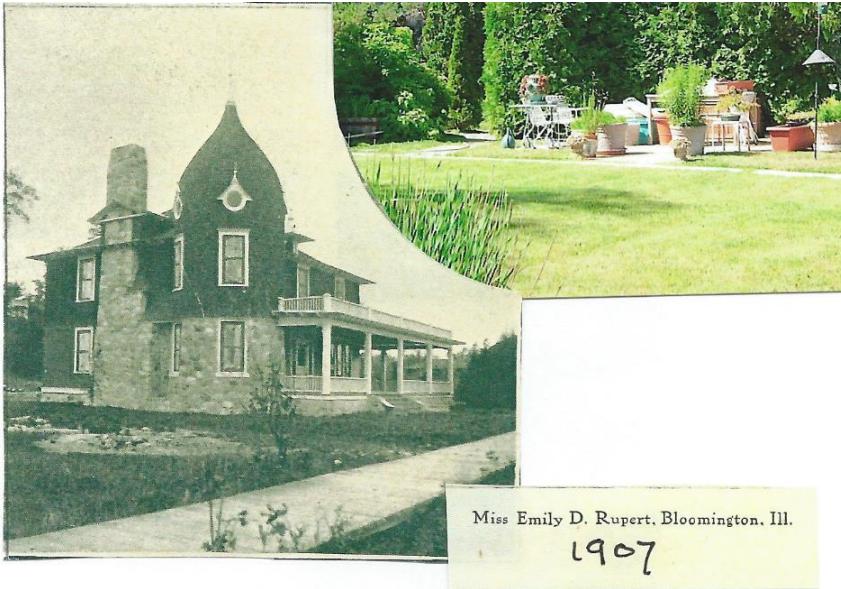
- Shallow pitch hip roof with exposed rafter tails and rectangular two-story massing.
- Narrow clapboard and shingle siding.
- Corner tower with stone base, shingle siding, and dome roof, including round windows in dome and metal spire.
- Fieldstone chimney and base of tower.

Condition

The cottage is in good repair no issues are apparent. The large shrubbery close to the foundation could cause moisture problems and decay in the future.
