The gable front with round window over the second-story porch with paired Doric columns, along with the rectangular massing, complex roof shapes, and narrow clapboard siding are all indicative of the Queen Anne style. The deep roof overhangs have decorative brackets, and the front porch has a turned balustrade. The first-floor windows on the west elevation with the multi-paned upper sash appear to be original. The first-floor windows in the multi-sided bay are commonly found on Queen Anne style houses.

Significant Features

- Complex roof shapes including the gable front with round window above the second-floor porch, the multi-sided roof over the west bay, and deep overhangs with decorative brackets.
- Wrap around front porch with turned balustrade and paired Doric columns and recessed side porch at the southwest corner of the house.
- Second story porch under gable front with paired Doric columns.
- Narrow clapboard siding.

Condition

The cottage is generally in good repair with no apparent issues. It retains most of its original features.
