This two-and-a-half-story cottage with its cross-gambrel roof, stucco first floor, shingle sided second floor, and deep fullwidth front porch with stucco pillars are all typical of the Shingle style. The windows with the diamond pane upper sash, the bay windows on the north and south elevations, and the gable fronts on the full width front porch with the stucco clad knee wall, wide stair and masonry wing walls all contribute to the historic appearance of the cottage.

#### **Significant Features**

- Cross gambrel roof with windows in the gable ends and the flared eave across the bottom of the gable ends.
- Stucco at the first floor and shingle siding at the second floor.
- Full width porch with stucco knee walls, massive stucco pillars, gable fronts, and wide stairs with stucco wing walls.
- Bay windows on north and south elevations, all windows with diamond pattern in upper sash.

#### Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
