Architectural Style Colonial Revival with Prairie elements

The two-story side gambrel roof with a flared bottom that overhangs the first floor and has symmetrical shed roof dormers and the symmetrical end chimneys all contribute to the Colonial Revival style of this cottage. The half width front porch with its tapered pillars, clapboard clad knee walls and pillars, and carved brackets, along with the house having clapboard siding at the first floor and shingles at the second, are all Prairie style elements.

Significant Features

- Side gambrel roof with flared eaves, symmetrical shed roof dormers, end chimneys, and gable end windows.
- Half width front porch with clapboard sided knee walls and flared pillars that continue through the roof to support the railing above. Brackets near the roof.
- Clapboard sided first floor; shingle sided second floor.
- Enclosed rear second floor sleeping porch with wall "scuppers" and exposed rafter tails at roof.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
