Architectural Style Queen Anne

This two-and-a-half story cottage has classic Queen Anne cross gable, vertical massing with steeply pitched roofs and a gable front that extends over the front porch. The porch has shingle clad knee walls (not the original cladding) and Doric columns supporting a shallow pitch roof. The wide stairs have shingle clad wing walls. The second-floor windows have angled muntins in the upper half, and there is a wide window with angled muntin pattern between two narrow double-hung windows in the center of the gable front. There is an arched vent at the top of the front and south gables.

### **Significant Features**

- Cross-gable vertical massing with steep roof pitches and deep eaves that reach the top of the second- floor windows.
- Gable front that projects over the front porch with three windows in the center of the gable and arched opening at the top of the gable.
- Full width front porch (even though a portion has been enclosed) with knee wall and Doric columns.
- Windows with angled muntin pattern throughout the second floor, arched vents at the top of the east and south gables, end chimney in the north gable.

### **Condition**

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
