Year Built c. 1890 and c. 1900

Architectural Style Folk Victorian with Shingle style addition

It appears that the original cottage named "The Midget" was reduced in size and a newer two-and-a-half story Shingle style cottage with a side gambrel roof was constructed to the east. The east side of the side-gambrel roof originally had a shed roof dormer creating a second-floor porch, that has been replaced with a gambrel front that extends out over the front porch. The wrap around porch retrains its original square pillars with carved brackets on each side. The north and south gambrel ends have windows with multi-panes in the upper sash, and a Palladian window at the top of the gable, characteristic of the Shingle style. The north elevation has a three-sided bay window, another characteristic.

Significant Features

- Gambrel roof with Palladian window in the north and south gable ends, and the multi-sided bay window in the north elevation.
- Wrap around front porch with square pillars and carved brackets and railing between the pillars.
- Central stone chimney.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
