This two-story cottage with beveled clapboard siding has a steep side gable roof with a cross gable at the north end, typical massing for the Queen Anne style. The projecting front gable creating a second-floor porch with sided knee walls and thin Doric columns are also characteristic. The wrap around front porch with shed roof supported by Doric columns and wood railing are another Queen Anne feature.

Significant Features

- Two-story steep side gable with cross gable at north end, projecting front gable creating second floor porch with clapboard knee walls and thin Doric columns.
- Wrap around front porch with shed roof supported by Doric columns.
- Windows in gable ends and front cross gable.
- First floor window with shorter upper sash than lower sash, double multi-pane doors in the south elevation.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues except for small areas of peeling paint.
