Architectural Style Stick style

This two-and-a-half story cottage is a relatively intact example of the Stick style. The vertical siding with wood trim decoration, cross gable roof with central eight-sided tower with pyramid roof and shed roof dormers, wood decoration in the gable ends, as well as the wrap-around front porch with thin posts and decorative brackets are all indicative of the style.

Significant Features


- Steeply pitched cross gable roof massing with eight-sided central tower with pyramidal roof and shed roof dormers. Wood decoration in the gables.
- Vertical siding with wood trim decoration.
- Wrap around front porch with central stair, thin posts and carved brackets supporting a shallow roof which creates a second-floor porch with remnants of the original railing. The roof structures at the gable ends have thin posts and carved brackets.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with some areas of deteriorating paint. It retains most of its original appearance.
